LE COMPARATIF-

(comparatives)

Like in English there are rules when using comparatives, we have our own process in French as well to compare two things or ideas together.

1) <u>Les Adjectifs et Adverbs</u>

↓ Le comparatif de supériorité (*more...than*)

The adjective or adverb you are comparing should have its ending change depending on the gender of the subject (*M/F*)

ex: Paul is bigger than me → Paul est plus gros que moi. : Paul is a man, so the adjective gros (big) takes

the masculine form.

Léa is bigger than Paul → Léa est plus grosse que Paul: Here Léa is a woman, so the adjective used in

the comparison becomes feminine.

He is taller than you \rightarrow Il est *plus* grand *que* toi.

When *que* is followed by a name or a pronoun starting with a vowel, the *e* disappears!

ex: Fabien est *plus* petit *qu'*Olivier → smaller

Je suis *plus* intelligent *qu'*elle



: the adjectives Bon and Bien are irregular. Their comparative form becomes Meilleur and Mieux

♣ Le comparatif d'égalité (as....as)

The adjective or adverb you are equally comparing should have its ending change depending on the gender of the subject (M/F) as well:

ex: Paul is as big as me → Paul est aussi gros que moi

Léa as big as Paul → Léa est aussi grosse que Paul

He as tall as you → Il est aussi grand que toi.

When *que* is followed by a name or a pronoun starting with a vowel, the *e* disappears! *ex:* Fabien est aussi petit qu'Olivier

Je suis *aussi* intelligent *qu'elle*

♣ Le comparatif d'infériorité (less....than)

MOINS + Adj/adv + QUE

The adjective or adverb you are equally comparing should have its ending change depending on the gender of the subject (M/F) as well:

ex: Paul is less bigger than me \rightarrow Paul est moins gros que moi.

Léa is less bigger than Paul → Léa est *moins* gros<u>se</u> que Paul

He is less taller than you → Il est *moins* grand *que* toi.

When *que* is followed by a name or a pronoun starting with a vowel, the *e* disappears!

ex: Fabien est moins petit qu'Olivier

Je suis *moins* intelligent *qu'elle*
