2) The verb to be

The verb *to be* in Russian is **быть**. (In their infinitive form, verbs always end with **ть**; it is the equivalent of the English “to”). When it comes to conjugating *to be* in the Present form, it is rather simple, **it does not exist in Russian**, so, we don’t use it.

ex: I am a student → in Russian, we say “I student” → я студент (m.)
я студентка (f.)

So basically, as long as you know the subject pronouns and vocabulary (such as jobs, nationalities, age...), you can talk in Russian... Talking about vocabulary, let’s learn some jobs today!
