

## Цифры (Numbers)

In today's lesson, we are going to study numbers. Now that you know the subject pronouns and that there is no verb "to be", you are going to be able to make your first sentences by giving your phone number!

### 1) Numbers

Learning numbers in Russian is not the easiest and it requires a lot of practice. If the spelling of the numbers is rather logic and structured (*the use of colours makes it more simple to remember*), the tricky part remains the pronunciation, so you will have to be careful with the stresses here (*the most radical changes being highlighted in bold to help you pay attention*).

## 2) Phone numbers

As if learning numbers itself was not hard enough, Russian phone numbers are usually given per **3 digits** and not one by one as in English, so you will need to master the hundreds!

In Russia, phone numbers are composed of the number **8 to call between cities and regions**, followed by the **regional code** of the area you are calling (*in our example, we are calling Vladivostok area*) and then the **actual number of the person** composed of 7 digits.

ex: ① 8 423 642 32 19 → **восемь, четыреста двадцать три, шестьсот сорок два, тридцать два, девятнадцать**

And even though it is true that it is not vital to know about this, it can become handy as sometimes some people give you their phone number dropping the regional code because it is obvious to them and when you try calling them, the call is not going through because you didn't compose it properly. So, if this happens to you, and you ever only get the 7 digits, you need to look online at the regional code and do not forget the 8 at the beginning!

## 3) Dialogue
